Those trails of smoke may not be traditional blue and white decorations – yet they do retain a hint of fiery dragons. The vases' necks turns to lips, and the only flowers present are cigarettes. I guess I could put this in the dark section, with the floral Vanitas of the still life tradition replaced by the deathly implications of smoking. Go further, and the vases are lungs. But they still made me laugh...
