**Visit this / 'More Overall', Irène Laub
Gallery, Brussels**
Iceland on tour

French gallerist Irène Laub founded her eponymous space in Brussels' Ixelles neighbourhood as a meeting point where artists could create together. At its current show, More Overall, held with the support of Reykjavík's i8 Gallery and the Icelandic embassy, three artists explore the complexities of Iceland's art scene. Ingólfur Arnarsson, Brussels-based Guðný Rósa Ingimarsdóttir and Hildigunnur Birgisdóttir – who is currently representing Iceland at the 60th Venice Art Biennale – have gathered a selection of pieces made from fragments of everyday items and various materials. Drawings and collages reinterpret familiar objects, encouraging us to question our perceptions of reality.

For Ingimarsdóttir, who was born in Reykjavík but has been based in Belgium for the past 30 years, this exhibition was a chance to connect with a scene that she mostly observes from a distance but likes to return to. “Everyone who leaves has the need to come back, both to share and to feed off our roots,” she tells *Konfekt*. *More Overall* runs until 26 October.
